Here's just some of the Arrests in the area

Drugs.

On 06th October a 23 year old male was arrested at Asda, Hereford on suspicion of supplying class A drugs. He has been remanded and is due to attend court in January.

General Policing.

During the month of October 2015 we've had **338** incidents reported to the police for the St Martins, Hinton Red Hill & Lower Bullingham area.

50 of those incidents were what we call "Grade 1", which means a 999 emergency call, which is either something life threatening or a crime in progress.

An average month for incidents, and also crimes, but we have detected a good percentage which were typically the assaults and drug offences.

Pets

Animals do not like bonfires or fireworks. The flames and noise upsets them. They should always be kept safely indoors. Make sure that they cannot get out through open windows and doors. It is best to keep the curtains closed too and it may be necessary to keep them indoors for several nights around November 5th.



Safety tips for adults

Young people should watch and enjoy fireworks at a safe distance and follow the safety rules for using sparklers. Only adults should deal with firework displays and the lighting of fireworks. They should also take care of the safe disposal of fireworks once they have been used.

- 1. Plan your firework display to make it safe and enjoyable
- 2. Keep fireworks in a closed box and use them one at a time
- Read and follow the instructions on each firework using a torch if necessary
- 4. Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back
- 5. Keep naked flames, including cigarettes, away from fireworks
- 6. Never return to a firework once it has been lit
- 7. Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them
- 8. Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators
- Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire
- 10. Make sure that the fire is out and surroundings are made safe before leaving.

The Cold Mornings are coming

Don't become a victim, read the advice below.

Although vehicle crime is low across Warwickshire and West Mercia, cars are stolen from driveways every winter because owners leave them unattended, with the keys in the ignition, while they warm up and the windscreens defrost.

Some vehicle owners nip inside just a few seconds to collect a bag or finish the last mouthful of coffee – but that's all an opportunist thief needs.

Insurance companies may not pay out for cars stolen in this way – and if your house keys are taken as well, you're making your home vulnerable.
