About Your SNT Team


Safer Neighbourhood Teams work with local people and partners to identify, tackle and solve issues that matter to the community where you live.

Arrests of Note

24yr old Male from the Hunderton area, arrested for breach of bail, charged and detained for court.

Belmont Road, bailed to Police Station. 26yr old Female from Hunderton, arrested for drink driving in West Street, Hereford. Charged and bailed to court.

37yr old Female from Newton Farm, arrested for drug driving in Brampton Road. Bailed to police station.

18 yr old male from the Newton Farm area, arrested for breach of Criminal Behaviour Order. Pending other offences.

Sexting

There is a growing trend amongst children and young people taking indecent photos of themselves and sending them to each other or posting them in public forums.

When people talk of "**Sexting**" this usually refers to sending or receiving:

Naked Pictures or "nudes"

"Underwear shots"

Sexual or "dirty pics"

Rude text messages or videos

Many see it as harmless fun or others see it as a way to push boundaries and experiment.

What are the risks:

Images can get into the wrong hands. Often when young people finish a relationship the partner decides to circulate the images as"revenge", and can lead to bullying or harassment. Once an image is on the internet, there is no control of where it then goes or who copies it and self taken images are appearing on paedophile chat sites and forums.

What the law says:

Children "Sexting" may be committing criminal offences. If you are U18, the law sees you as a child, therefore having images of anyone U18 you would technically be in possession of indecent images of children under the:

Protection of Children Act 1978.

General Policing

During the month of February 2016 we had **154** incidents reported to the police for the Belmont Safer Neighbourhood area, which were either attended or dealt with by us or response officers.

29 of these incidents were what we call "Grade 1", which means a 999 emergency call, which is either something life threatening or a crime in progress. A typical number of incidents reported as last month. An increase in crimes this month, the greater numbers being Assaults. However we have processed less detections compared to last month.
